Organisation	Grant	Purpose
	amount £	To support a new post of Disability Sports Development
Ability Shetland	40,000	Coordinator with the aim of growing participation in physical activity and sport for people with disabilities.
Alzheimer Scotland	22,900	To help safeguard their wide range of activities as their fundraising opportunities recover from the impact of Covid-19.
British Red Cross	24,800	Funding towards their Shetland Community Support Service, which has seen increased demand during the Covid-19 crisis and a drop in fundraising opportunities. Their focus is on social isolation and loneliness.
COPE Ltd	225,000	To allow the organisation to provide focused placements, training, support and employment opportunities to adults with learning and/or physical disabilities.
Dogs Against Drugs	20,000	To support their Drugs Education Programme delivered in schools to raise awareness of drugs misuse.
Gaada	50,000	To support their wide range of activities in community art with an emphasis on art for individuals with disabilities.
Mind Your Head	75,000	To support their services in providing mental health support for people below the threshold for medical intervention. In particular, support for those not qualifying for, or not willing to accept statutory support.
Moving On	35,000	To support their services in assisting those in need by reason of ill-health, disability, or other disadvantage by developing a service to support people to overcome barriers to employment.
NSPCC Scotland	4,000	Funding towards an educational schools programme "Speak out Stay safe", teaching primary school children about abuse and neglect and who they can get support from when something is wrong, including Childline.
OPEN Project	31,200	To support the delivery of four main activities - Peer Education, Peer Mentoring, Emotional Wellbeing and Resilience Project and OPEN Up (a drop in youth café). Working with young people aged 16 to 25 who are among the most vulnerable and hard to reach. This is overseen by Voluntary Action Shetland.
Relationships Scotland - Shetland	29,800	Funding towards a Family Connections Project. This project will establish a child contact service to support children to maintain relationships with the parent they no longer live with, or with other extended family members with whom they no longer have contact.
Royal Voluntary Service	62,600	To support a range of community projects for elderly and disabled people in Shetland and to increase their proposed service delivery.
Shetland Amenity Trust	1,171,600	To support the delivery of their wide range of services in the fields of heritage and culture.
Shetland Arts Development Agency	650,000	Funding towards the costs of promoting, developing and delivering activities in the fields of dance, drama, theatre, film, literature, music, crafts and visual arts.
Shetland Befriending Scheme – 16+	12,700	Funding towards a befriending scheme for people over the age of 16. The focus is on those who are having difficulty managing their own home and living independently. This is

		overseen by Voluntary Action Shetland.
Shetland Befriending Scheme – CYP	53,000	Funding towards a befriending scheme which offers young people an opportunity to form a trusting relationship with an adult, to promote the young person's welfare and personal development. This is overseen by Voluntary Action Shetland.
Shetland Care Attendants Scheme	74,300	Funding to support their services in providing short breaks for carers in their own home through employed Care Attendants going into carers' homes to look after the cared person. This is a partnership project with funding also supporting Voluntary Action Shetland Carers Service.
Shetland Islands Citizens Advice Bureau	209,400	Funding towards delivering a general information and advice service and the provision of a new service targeting those hardest to reach.
Shetland Islands Council Rural Care Model	1,986,200	Funding to add value to the community care provided in Shetland as the level of service is over and above that normally provided by a local authority.
Shetland Link Up	55,700	able the organisation to offer an informal meeting place to support people affected by mental health problems.
Shetland Rape Crisis	32,200	To enhance and expand their services. The areas of activity supported are Core Provision, Prevention and Activism Work, Advocacy Service and Emotional and Therapeutic Support Service.
Shetland Recreational Trust	3,147,200	To support the cost of leisure and sports facilities at locations throughout Shetland.
Shetland Women's Aid	100,000	To enhance and expand the services they deliver. They provide a wide range of support and therapy for women, children and young people as well as a safe place to live, when required.
The Swan Trust	28,300	To support the costs associated with maintaining, operating and promoting the Swan sailing vessel.
Voluntary Action Shetland - Core	86,400	Funding towards delivering a central point for advice and information to the voluntary sector in Shetland.
Voluntary Action Shetland – Market House	93,000	Funding to support the operation of Market House.
